



CIVIL NUCLEAR CONSTABULARY

The heraldic badge is an emblem used to show loyalty to an individual or family. Such badges were worn on the clothing of the followers or servants of Knights. For example Crusaders wore a Red Cross. The badge would also be embroidered on uniforms and other belongings to show who owned them.



The Prince of Wales's feathers is the heraldic badge of the Prince of Wales. The badge is worn by players in the Welsh Rugby Union team. The badge is also displayed by many regiments of the British Army who have an historical connection with the Prince of Wales.

The Civil Nuclear Constabulary Police badge is designed to show its allegiance in a number of ways:

- the centre shows its allegiance to the Civil Nuclear Police Authority by incorporating the Griffin, found on the Authority's Coat of Arms
- the use of the Brunswick Star shows its allegiance to the Police Service
- the Crown shows its allegiance to Her Majesty the Queen.
