## Policy Statement

The Civil Nuclear Constabulary (The Constabulary) will ensure procedures regarding photographic and video Identification are carried out in accordance with;

- For England; the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984 (PACE), and the Codes of Practice contained therein, with specific reference to Code D of the Act, as regards identification procedures.
- For Scotland; the Criminal Procedures (Scotland) Act 1995

For the most part this will be achieved by adopting the procedures of the Host Home Office Constabulary or Scottish Government Police Force. To enable the Constabulary to meet its statutory commitments it will:

- Ensure that each Operational Unit or Operational Unit establishes an agreement with the host force, to use **their** procedures in relation to photographic and video Identification.
- Establish Local Operational Procedures (LOP) to protect the integrity of future photographic and video identification. These procedures will be in accordance with the Codes of Practice relevant to England, Wales and Scotland, to cover street identification issues, the taking of both still and moving picture images, and the handling of potential witnesses.
- Ensure front line officers are effectively briefed on requirements in this area.
- Ensure a risk assessment is in place and officers receive the required training.

## Aims of the Policy

To ensure that the proper procedures and handling of the relevant evidence are carried out and documented, and will be of the required standard to present before a Court Of Law
