## Policy Statement

The Civil Nuclear Constabulary (The Constabulary) uses a model called 'Standing Committee on Police Establishment' or SCOPE. The purpose of 'SCOPE' is to utilise a formula to assess resourcing levels at the various nuclear licensed sites protected by the Constabulary.

The modified scope model is based on the original formula as set out in the MS spreadsheets dryratio.xls and drytrng.xls.

Modifications to the original SCOPE model include

- A modular structure to the formula
- Greater transparency in the model to ease the understanding of non-experts
- The greater use of cross-references between different modules (worksheets) in the model
- The ability to use the model in a more flexible way, when new factors come into effect

SCOPE uses a model designed to take account of a number of historical factors, these include sickness, restrictions & recuperations, numbers of resignations, training, overtime, and supernumerary & potential extensions of jurisdiction.

The SCOPE process then moves from the mathematical calculations to consultations between the individual site management, the Constabulary & the Office of Civil Nuclear Security to agree the resourcing levels.

## Aims of the Policy

To ensure there are sufficient staff to meet the Nuclear Industries Malicious Capabilities Planning Assumptions effectively at every site and for every foreseeable eventuality during the movement of nuclear materials.
